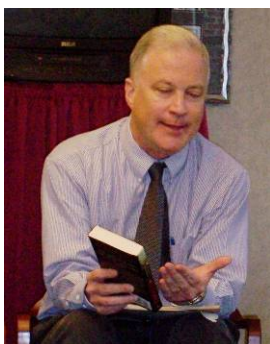


Benefits of Grant Writing

Resources to Help You Achieve Your Goals

For many college faculty and staff, a gap exists between the many projects they would like to undertake and the time and resources available to do so. The Office of Sponsored Programs can help you close that gap by guiding you through the process of seeking external financial support through grants.

Grants from public and private sponsors can help you achieve professional goals such as:

- piloting new initiatives
- training
- undertaking scholarly research
- developing, revising, or enhancing courses or curricula
- starting up a community service or outreach project

Grant projects can include funding for a variety of needs, including:

- salaries and wages
- fringe benefits
- student research support
- consultants
- travel
- equipment and computers
- materials and supplies
- books and publications

Step-by-Step Support

The Office of Sponsored Programs can guide you through each step in developing and implementing successful grant projects:

- brainstorming project ideas
- researching potential government, foundation, and corporate sponsors
- narrowing your pool of potential sponsors by matching your project's goals with sponsors' priorities
- preparing you to contact sponsors *before* drafting a proposal
- writing a persuasive proposal
- designing a readable proposal
- constructing a realistic budget
- assisting with reporting requirements once your project is funded
