College Catalog **English (ENGL)**

English supports the mission of the College as a Catholic, liberal arts college embracing the Norbertine tradition of community, committed to providing an educational environment that is intellectual, spiritually and personally challenging. English majors and faculty interact inside and outside the classroom, engaging in conversations about literature, connecting literature to spiritual concerns, and encouraging each other to participate actively in the College community.

The English discipline's vision is to help English majors to become caring, well-rounded citizens. English majors graduate with the knowledge, skills, and desire necessary to make positive contributions to the communities they enter. To that end, the English major includes the following:

- Coverage - students will explore the broad canvas of English and American literature, which we recognize as an evolving rather than static body of work;
- Skills - students will practice the essential skills of critical inquiry through academic writing;
- Critical Theory - students will learn the theoretical debates that frame the study of literature and how to apply theoretical paradigms to readings of literature;
- Language - students will engage in the study of a foreign language and will be encouraged to learn the history of the English language;
- Artistic Creativity - students will be given the opportunity to pursue creative writing;
- Service to the Community - students will be provided with a wealth of opportunities to serve the College and outside communities through academic organizations, extra-curricular service projects, and so forth.

The English discipline strongly urges students to take more English courses than required for the major or minor.

English Requirements

English Major (10 courses plus a foreign language through 102): ENGL 150; 225 or 226; 235 or 236; 305; a major author course: 325, 334 or 339; 400; plus 4 ENGL electives* and a senior portfolio **.

English Major with Secondary Certification (10 courses plus a foreign language through 102): ENGL 150; 225 or 226; 235 or 236; 290; 305; 310 or 356; a major author course: 325, 334, or 339; 400; plus 2 ENGL electives* and a senior portfolio **.

Special Note: Students must fulfill their Area 5 General Education requirement by taking ENGL 150 and their Area 7 requirement by taking a foreign language through 102.

English Major with a Creative Writing emphasis (10 courses plus a foreign language through 102): ENGL 150; 225 or 226; 235 or 236; 305; a major author course: 325, 334, or 339; 307 or 308; 400; 425; plus 2 ENGL electives* and a senior portfolio **.

English Minor (6 courses): ENGL 150; 225 or 226; 235 or 236; 305; a major author course: 325, 334, or 339; plus 1 ENGL elective *.

English Teaching Minor (6 courses): ENGL 150; 290; 225 or 226 or 235 or 236; 305; 310 or 356; plus 1 ENGL elective *. *Special Note: Students must fulfill their Area 5 General Education requirement by taking ENGL 150.*

* HUMA 222, HUMA 262 and WOLT 325 may be taken as ENGL electives. Students may take more than one ENGL 389 (Special Topics), ENGL 400 (Advanced Seminar), or ENGL 491 (Tutorial in Advanced Creative Writing) course with the approval of the advisor and course instructor.

**All English majors are required to collect and submit a senior English portfolio (one essay or writing assignment from each ENGL course taken and a self-evaluative introductory essay) in order to fulfill graduation requirements (ENGL 499). During their coursework, English majors will store essays and writing assignments electronically under the supervision of their academic advisor(s). Senior portfolios (ENGL 499) are due at the conclusion of the English major's coursework at the College.
