OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

GPA: A 2.75 GPA at the end of the freshman year is required for continuation in the education program. To be certified, students must maintain a 2.75 GPA overall and achieve a 3.0 GPA in major and/or minor.

Human Relations: The Teacher Education Program requires that all students complete 50 hours (25 each of A & B) of human relations experience:

- A. Contact with minority reps (i.e. Attendance at speakers or events)
- B. Contact with minority students (i.e. Tutoring or other face-to-face activity)

Portfolio: To be certified, student must complete an acceptable certification portfolio based on the Wisconsin AND 2 (two) SNC Standards.

Praxis Series Tests: Praxis I (PPST): Taken during the freshman year, students must receive passing scores on tests of reading, writing, and math to be admitted to the Teacher Education Program. Praxis II: All pre-service teachers must demonstrate their content knowledge by passing a standardized test (Praxis II) in order to student teach.
