* Dormitory fees listed here are an average of four freshmen dorms, double occupancy

* Summer dormitory fees are estimated: \$13 per night for double or single.

* Meal plan fees listed here are an average of 3 food plans available to students

IMPORTANT NOTES:

1. ESL Students may complete one level of instruction in December, May and August.
2. The ESL program offers 3 levels of instruction: Low, Intermediate, and Advanced. Typically students need 12 to 18 months to move from low level to completion of advanced level. Completion of the advanced level means students are prepared to begin College classes
3. Students may pass a level with a grade of "A" or "B". Below "B/C" is "Repeat"
4. Dormitory fees are based on the average cost of 4 freshman dormitories: shared room
5. **Additional fee:** Activity fee \$50 each session; \$50 per month in the summer.
6. **Additional fee:** Health Insurance fee is \$68 each month (\$18 per week)
7. **Additional fee:** Orientation fee \$50 (new students only)
8. **Additional fee:** Textbooks: about \$200 - \$250 each level
9. **Additional (optional) fee:** \$80 for blanket, pillow, sheets, mattress cover, towel, coat hangers, and pre-paid calling card (to call home after you arrive!)

PAYING FEES

Students pay fees about two weeks after classes begin. All fees are paid in the College Finance Office. The Finance Office charges 1% (one percent) late fee each month that fees are not paid. **To pay fees with MasterCard, American Express and Discover Card, go to: CREDIT CARD PAYMENT <<http://www.snc.edu/financedepartment>>**

SPECIAL FEATURES:

- Free airport pickup at Green Bay Airport (GRB) only 10 minutes from school
- Orientation to campus and community; language placement test
- Three levels of instruction: Elementary, Intermediate, & Advanced
- College dormitory living; usually 2 students in each room (homestay not available)
- Friendship families in the community (not be available in summer)
- Conversation partners with American students at SNC (not available in summer)
- Free tutors available afternoons and evenings
- College resources include: computer labs, sports center, student union, cafeteria, dormitories, health center, clubs & organizations, trips and activities, music practice rooms, career and immigration counseling services

TYPICAL CLASS SCHEDULE: 8:00 AM to noon daily

- 8:00 to 9:05: writing classes: Elementary (E), Intermediate (I), Advanced (A)
- 9:15 to 10:00: listening classes: Elementary (E), Current Events (I), Lectures-Notetaking (A)
- 10:10 to 10:55: reading classes: Elementary (E), Intermediate (I), Advanced (A)
- 11:05 to 11:50: speaking classes: Elementary (E), American Society (I), Debate (A)

CURRICULUM NOTES:

1. Students need a minimum grade of "B/C" to pass a level. Grades below "B/C" are "Repeat"
2. Students may move up to the next level in August, December, and May
3. Students who consistently miss classes or do not do their homework will be asked to leave

IMPORTANT POLICIES AND RULES

- Students under age 22 must live in College dormitories. August 1, 2010 this rule changes to "minimum age 24 in order to request permission to live off campus."
- ESL tuition is not refunded after the second week of classes.
- Students under age 21 are prohibited by State law from drinking alcohol
- Smoking cigarettes is not allowed in all College buildings

STUDENTS WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE IF THEY...

- Fail to follow College rules in the dormitories
- Fail to maintain full-time student status or fail to pay fees in a timely manner
