Coming of Age in America

During his sabbatical leave in the Fall Semester of 2003, Reed Hardy's main focus was to explore the interrelated topics of healthy human development, cultural practices that promote healthy human development, and the possibility of planning cultural change to promote more effective developmental practices. As he explored these issues he repeatedly came to recognize that it is easier to define unhealthy development than its opposite. Taking up this focus, he swiftly saw that the way our culture handles adolescence is rich in improvement potential. Adolescents in our society spend more than ten years in developmental limbo. It is during this period that we lose many of them. By any standard we have a lot invested in these youth; losing them is especially tragic for they are so close to making their own contribution to society. Is there a way out of this trap?
