Interdisciplinary programs can be incredibly stimulating, but they bring unique challenges. As many of us have seen, the integration of traditional disciplines creates tensions pedagogically and programmatically. This workshop will help faculty members thrive in the midst of such tensions while enjoying the benefits of wide-ranging and collaborative scholarship.

The workshop will be facilitated by Dr. George A. Lopez. Lopez holds the Hesburgh Chair in Peace Studies at the Kroc Institute for International Peace Studies at the University of Notre Dame. An award winning teacher and consultant who has worked in the interdisciplinary field of peace studies for over 40 years, Lopez is widely known for his prolific scholarship on human rights, ethics and economic sanctions. Along with David Cortright he has produced ground-breaking, policy relevant research on economic sanctions, including offering arguments and data in 2002-03 regarding the absence of weapons of mass destruction in Iraq due to sanctions. He has been a Senior Fellow at the United States Institute of Peace and has just concluded 10 months of service on the UN Security Council Panel of Experts regarding sanctions on North Korea.

There will be ample time for participants to share experiences and ask questions.
