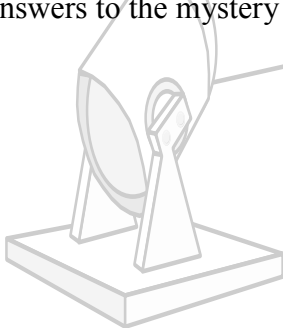

“Ancient Gods and Temples of Peru”

The Incas, the most powerful Native American empire of all time, claimed that their initial rise to power occurred in the 1400s when they were attacked by the rival Chanka nation. With their defeat of the Chankas, the Incas began a campaign of conquest that led to their domination of half a continent.

Yet what was the Chankas’ version of the Inca-Chanka war? Were they really powerful enough to threaten the early Inca state? What was life like for the Chanka people before and after their defeat by the Incas? Join Dr. Sabine Hyland, co-director of the Chanka archaeology project, as she describes her explorations in the remote Peruvian countryside in search of answers to the mystery of Inca origins.
