Associate Professor of History at Moorehead State University

Margaret Sankey earned her Ph.D. in Early Modern British History from Auburn University in 2002, specializing in military and elite patronage culture in early 18th century Europe. Her book, *Jacobite Prisoners of the 1715 Rebellion: Preventing and Punishing Insurrection in Early Hanoverian Britain*, was published in 2005.

Dr. Sankey, who has Asperger Syndrome, will lead a discussion on the following topics:

- ◆ What Asperger Syndrome is and what it isn't;
- ◆ How Asperger Syndrome students may struggle on campus;
- ◆ Playing to strengths and minimizing weaknesses of the student;
- ◆ Likely classroom situations, suggestions for coping;
- ◆ Dr. Sankey's personal experience, reflections on making the challenges worthwhile.
