**H1N1 FLU VACCINE CLINICS FOR HIGH RISK TARGET POPULATIONS  
SPONSORED BY  
PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCIES OF BROWN COUNTY, DE PERE AND ONEIDA NATION**

The public health agencies of Brown County, De Pere and Oneida Nation will be sponsoring their first H1N1 flu vaccine clinics for high risk target populations. Based on current guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), individuals eligible to receive vaccine at these clinics include:

- Pregnant women
- Health care and emergency medical services personnel who provide direct patient care
- Persons who live with or provide care for infants younger than 6 months of age
- Children age 6 months through 4 years
- Children and adolescents age 5 to 18 years who have medical conditions that place them at higher risk of complications

Only individuals in these target groups will receive the vaccine during these clinics. The H1N1 vaccine will be administered in one of two ways, as a nasal spray or as a shot, depending on a person's age and health factors. Anyone who is experiencing flu-like symptoms should not come to the clinics.

The clinics, which are being offered at no charge, will be held as follows:

**Thursday November 12<sup>th</sup> from 3 to 6:30 p.m. at Brown County Veterans Memorial Arena** located at 1901 South Oneida Street in Green Bay. **Friday November 13<sup>th</sup> from 3 to 6 p.m. at Oneida Nation Elementary School** located at N7125 Seminary Road in Oneida. For more information on this clinic contact Oneida Community Health Services at (920) 869-4840.

Other targeted clinics are **tentatively scheduled** for:

- Saturday November 14<sup>th</sup> from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Brown County Veterans Memorial Arena
- Saturday November 14<sup>th</sup> from 8:30 to 11 a.m. at Oneida Nation Elementary School.

However, holding these clinics is dependent on vaccine availability. Confirmation of the November 14<sup>th</sup> clinics will be made publicly as soon as possible.

Additional public health H1N1 flu clinics will be offered as more vaccine is received in our communities. When the target groups have been reached and vaccine is more plentiful, it is expected that anyone wishing to be vaccinated will have the opportunity.
