Hall Directors

The Hall Director (HD) is a Bachelors Degree level full-time professional member of the REH staff with training and experience in Residential education and student development. Hall Directors live and work in the Residence Halls and are responsible for training and supervising the Resident Assistants, advising individual students and Hall Councils, enforcing rules and regulations, implementing administrative policies and procedures, and developing programs that contribute to student development. Residence Hall Directors are excellent resources for residents because of their training and referral skills.

Associate Hall Directors

Associate Hall Directors are upper class students who oversee Bergstrom and Michels Halls with the guidance of a Hall Director and also perform the same duties as Resident Assistants.

Assistant Hall Directors

Assistant Hall Directors aid the Hall Director in managing numerous tasks in the Hall while performing the same duties as Resident Assistants. Assistant Hall Directors help maintain the safe and friendly community of a Residence Hall.

Resident Assistants

Resident Assistants (RA)s are experienced student leaders who live on each floor of the Residence Halls. RAs facilitate active and cooperative living environments that are conducive to studying, personal growth, and safety. They also receive special training in all aspects of Residence Hall living to personally assist students and/or to make referrals.
