Graduation rate refers to the number of students entering the institution as full-time, first-time, degree or certificate seeking undergraduate students in a particular year (cohort), by race slash ethnicity and gender; the number completing their program within 150 percent of normal time to completion (6 year graduation rate). Graduation rates for first-time, full-time degree or certificate seeking undergraduate students are annually reported to the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) on the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data Systems (IPEDS) Graduation Rate Survey. Cohorts are adjusted for allowable exclusions including students who left the institution prior to graduation for any of the following reasons: death or were totally and permanent disability; service with a foreign aid service of the Federal Government (e.g. Peace Corps); or service on official church missions. All graduation rate figures reflect the adjusted cohort after allowable exclusions.
