Cohorts include the number of first-time, full-time incoming Freshman. The retention rate is a measure of the rate at which students persist in their educational program at an institution, expressed as a percentage. For four-year institutions, this is the percentage of first-time bachelors (or equivalent) degree-seeking undergraduates from the previous fall who are again enrolled in the second fall. Adjusted cohorts are used for calculating retention rates. Cohorts are adjusted for allowable exclusions including students who left the institution prior to graduation for any of the following reasons: death or were totally and permanent disability; service with a foreign aid service of the Federal Government (e.g. Peace Corps); or service on official church missions.
