St. Norbert coach Steve Opgenorth (Winona State, 2005) is 0-0 in his first season in De Pere.

Carthage coach Mike Yeager (Miami-Ohio, 1999) is 1-12 entering his third season in Kenosha.

About the Green Knights:

St. Norbert enters the 2014 season coming off its 15th Midwest Conference championship since 1985, and its 11th league title since 1989.

Last season, the Green Knights made their 11th overall NCAA Division III Playoffs appearance and 10th post-season trip since 1999.

Junior running back Brad Boockmeier, a second-team All-Midwest Conference selection last season, led the team in rushing a year ago with 812 yards on 171 carries with seven touchdowns. Boockmeier also led the Green Knights in receiving with 33 catches for 246 yards and one touchdown. Senior wide receiver Mark Villers is the leading returning pass catcher at his position, with 27 receptions for 360 yards. Senior quarterback James Tringali enters his third season as the starter. Tringali completed 148 of 278 passes for 1,784 yards with 11 touchdowns and eight interceptions last season.

Senior linebacker Matt Petersilka is the leading returning tackler. Petersilka finished with 55 tackles, 12.5 tackles-for-loss, 7.5 quarterback sacks, five pass breakups and two interceptions. Senior linebacker Zach Klarkowski had 54 tackles with 6,5 tackles-for-loss.

Senior defensive back Dan Egan and senior kicker Randy Hill are St. Norbert's lone returning first-team All-MWC honorees. Egan was also a third-team All-America selection on special teams by D3football.com.

St. Norbert averaged 22.4 points and 293.3 yards per game last season. Defensively, the Green Knights allowed 16.1 points and 308.0 yards per game a year ago.

About the Red Men:

Carthage enters the 2014 season picked to finish eighth in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin pre-season coaches' poll. The Red Men finished 1-9 last season and was 0-7 in the CCIW.

Senior running back Derek Bellamy is the Red Men's leading returning rusher after totaling 430 yards and four touchdowns on 124 carries last season. Junior wide receiver Jamahl Wright led Carthage in receptions last season with 42 catches for 426 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore quar-

terback Nick Anzelmo is listed as the starter on the Carthage twodeep after completing 28 of 43 passes for 264 yards and three touchdowns a year ago.

Sophomore linebacker Greg Money, a second-team All-CCIW pick last season, led the Red Men in stops last season with 76 tackles and also had three interceptions. Sophomore defensive lineman Terrance Allen had 49 tackles with 16 tackles-for-loss and three quarterback sacks, while senior cornerback Marcus Harnett - also a second-team All-CCIW choice - had 40 tackles with a team-high four interceptions.

Carthage averaged 15.6 points and 286.5 yards per game last season. Defensively, the Red Men allowed 28.0 points and 384.8 yards per game.

Opening Day Observations:

St. Norbert has split its last 14 season openers. The Green Knights lost last year's season opener to John Carroll 41-0 last Aug. 30 at Toyota Park in Bridgeview, Ill.

The first four season-opening wins in the last 14 years all came against Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference foes Hamline University and the University of St. Thomas. The Green Knights defeated the Pipers 34-22 in St. Paul in 2000 and won 26-22 in 2001 in De Pere. St. Norbert then beat St. Thomas 35-31 in 2002 and 21-19 in 2003. St. Norbert topped Wartburg 42-35 in overtime in 2009's lidlifter to earn a split in the two-year series.

The four MIAC games from 2000-03 were the Green Knights' first openers against a non-Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference or NCAA Division II foe since 1983, the last time SNC won an opener prior to 2000 (24-14)Monmouth in 1983). The Green Knights opened against NCAA Division II Michigan Tech from 1984 to 1987, UW-Stevens Point in 1988 and 1989, UW-Oshkosh from 1990 to 1999, UW-Whitewater in 2004 and 2005, Olivet Nazarene in 2006 and 2007, Wartburg in 2008 and 2009 and St. Thomas again in

2010 and 2011. The Green Knights faced John Carroll to open 2012 and 2013.

St. Norbert, entering its 81st year of varsity football, is 37-37-6 in season openers.

The Green Knights are scheduled to begin a home-and-home series with UW-Stevens Point to open the 2016 and 2017 seasons. The 2016 opener will be at St. Norbert.

CCIW Chat:

Despite its fairly close proximity to Illinois, Saturday's game with St. Norbert marks just the third time since 1940 the Green Knights will match up with a current CCIW school in football.

St. Norbert's only football games in the last 74 years against a current CCIW foe came in the 1999 NCAA Division III Playoffs, a 39-32 loss to Augustana, and in the 2010 NCAA Playoffs, a 57-7 loss to North Central.

The Green Knights did face Carroll five times in football when the Pioneers were members of the CCIW from 1955-92, the most recent being in 1963.

The only other meetings for St. Norbert against a CCIW school came before that league was formed when it won and tied Wheaton in a pair of games in 1939 and 1940.

St. Norbert will also play CCIW favorite North Central next Saturday at Schneider Stadium.

Roster Diversity:

St. Norbert has 121 players listed on its roster as of Sept. 1, an increase of 21 from the same point in time last season.

On the 2014 roster, 77 players are from Wisconsin. Illinois has the second-highest total with 20 players hailing from the Land of Lincoln. Michigan is third with six players, including five from the Upper Peninsula. Three players reside in Florida, two in Arizona and one each from Colorado, Kentucky and Massachusetts.

There is one foreign player, sophomore defensive lineman Niklas Rosander from Sweden.
