Game Overview:

St. Norbert plays out the regular season with the NCHA finale against Lake Forest. The Green Knights have already clinched their 10th NCHA championship in 12 years and the No. 1 seed in the Peters Cup Playoffs.

The Series:

St. Norbert has played Lake Forest 57 times, more than any other opponent, and holds a 34-20-3 advantage. The Green Knights have played the Foresters at least once every season in the 20 years St. Norbert has had a hockey program. Lake Forest won the first 14 games in the series, with St. Norbert posting a 34-6-3 ledger since.

The Coaches:

St. Norbert coach Tim Coghlin (UW-Stevens Point, 1989) is 314-92-35 in his 15th season in De Pere. The Green Knights are 170-23-18 in the last seven seasons.

Lake Forest coach Tony Fritz is 337-389-40 in his 30th season in Lake Forest.

Last Meeting:

St. Norbert beat Lake Forest 6-0 on Jan. 19 at the Cornerstone Community Center. The Green Knights outshot Lake Forest 49-8, with the eight shots allowed tying a St. Norbert record.

Matt Boyd scored two goals while Tyler Allen, Nick Tabisz, Taylor Langford and Adam Hammerbeck added markers for St. Norbert.

Kyle Jones made eight saves for his 18th career shutout. Scott Campbell made 31 saves in 40 minutes, while Brandon Kohuch made 12 saves in the third period for Lake Forest.

About the Green Knights:

St. Norbert picked up three points on the road this past weekend with a 4-1 win at UW-River Falls and a 3-3 tie at UW-Stout. The Green Knights are 19-1-4 overall, 9-0-3 in the NCHA and own a 21-game unbeaten streak. St. Norbert has won its 10th NCHA championship in 12 years and its seventh consecutive title.

Senior forward Marc Belanger leads St. Norbert with 18 goals and 18 assists for 36 points. Sophomore forward Matt Boyd has 16 goals and 18 assists for 34 points. Sophomore forward Shane Wheeler, who has missed the last seven of the last nine games, has six goals and 16 assists for 22 points.

Senior goaltender Kyle Jones has an 13-1-3 record this season with a 1.27 goals against average and .941 save percentage. Freshman Blake Bashor is 6-0-1 with a 1.96 goals against average and .899 save percentage.

St. Norbert's power play is 33-for-142 this season (23.2 percent), while its penalty kill is 125-for-138 (90.6 percent).

About the Foresters:

Lake Forest enters Saturday's game with a 3-20-1 overall record and a 1-12 mark in the NCHA. The Foresters were swept last weekend, losing 7-0 at UW-Stout and 10-1 at UW-River Falls.

Junior forward Mike Kneeland leads the Foresters in scoring with seven goals and 11 assists for 18 points. Freshman forward Peter Pfeffer has six goals and seven assists for 13 points, while sophomore forward Adam Love has eight goals and four assists for 12 points.

Junior goaltender Scott Campbell is 3-10-1 with a 3.95 goals against average and .911 save percentage. Junior Brandon Kohuch is 0-10 with a 5.03 goals against average and .872 save percentage.

Lake Forest's power play is 13-for-116 (11.2 percent), while its penalty kill is 120-for-148 (81.1 percent).

Streak Stuff:

St. Norbert is currently on a 21-game unbeaten streak, going 17-0-4 since a 4-2 loss to Gustavus Adolphus on Nov. 3.

In addition to the current streak, St. Norbert has had two 19-game unbeaten streaks in its history, and fashioned a school record 26-game skein during the 2004-05 season. With its collection of unbeaten streaks of at least 19 games, St. Norbert now has four of the top 11 unbeaten streaks in NCAA Division III history. Middlebury is the only other Division III school which has at least two unbeaten streaks of at least 19 games.

St. Norbert's best ever stretch of hockey came at the end of the 2002-03 season into the 2003-04 season. The Green Knights carried a 19-game unbeaten streak (17-0-2) into the 2003 Frozen Four before losing to Norwich in a national semifinal. St. Norbert then opened the 2003-04 season 11-0-1. St. Norbert was 28-1-2 over that 31-game stretch.

Dating back to a 2-1 loss to UW-Stout at the Resch Center on Jan. 27, 2007, the Green Knights are an impressive 28-2-4 overall and are 17-0-4 against NCHA opponents.

Jones Jabber:

Senior goaltender Kyle Jones extended his Division III record for career shutouts to 20 with 29 saves in a 3-0 win over St. Scholastica on Feb. 2. The shutout of St. Scholastica was Jones' fifth shutout of this season.

Jones' 20 career shutouts are the second-most all-time by any collegiate goalie. Only current Buffalo Sabre Ryan Miller has more with 26 shutouts at Michigan State from 1999-2002.

By getting his fifth shutout of the 2007-08 season against St. Scholastica on Feb. 2, Jones now has five shutouts in a season for the third time in his career. In NCAA Division III history, a goaltender has put together a five-shutout season just eight times. Jones is the only goaltender to do it multiple times with five shutouts in 2004-05, seven in 2005-06 and five this season. Four of the eight occasions belong to St. Norbert goaltenders, with Chancy Colquhoun getting seven shutouts in 2003-04.

Jones' career record currently stands at 79-10-8, the most wins ever by a Division III goaltender. He has a 1.69 lifetime goals against average and .922 save percentage. Jones' career goals against average currently is the second-best in Division III history, behind Christian Carlsson of Middlebury, who had a 1.40 GAA from 1999-2002.

The next closest active Division III goaltender in wins to Jones is Oswego State's Ryan Scott, who is 59-20-6.

In addition to his 20 shutouts, Jones has 24 career games where he has allowed just one goal. In 98 career starts, Jones is 43-0-1 when allowing one goal or less. Jones has allowed one goal or less in 44.9 percent of his career starts.

Jones also owns or shares NCAA Division III records with shutouts in a season (seven), consecutive shutouts (four) and consecutive shutout minutes (337:22).

Jones, the 2006 NCHA Player of the Year, is 13-1-3 this season with a 1.27 GAA and .941 save percentage. He currently leads Division III in goals against average and is third in save percentage. In NCHA play this season, Jones has a 1.07 goals against average and .953 save percentage.

Amazingly, Jones has never been selected as a first-team All-American by the American Hockey Coaches Association.

Kill Comments:

St. Norbert is enjoying a strong season on the penalty kill. The Green Knights are 125-for-138 on the penalty kill this season, a solid 90.6 percent.

Should the Green Knights keep that pace on the penalty kill, it would rank in the top five all time in Division III history.

St. Norbert had its best season ever on the penalty kill a year ago, turning away 170 of 190 chances for 89.5 percent. The Green Knights led Division III in penalty kill in 2003 at 89.4 percent.

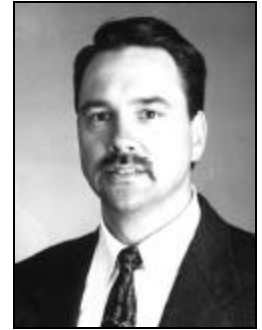

Seven of the 13 power-play goals St. Norbert has allowed this season came against Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference teams. Gustavus Adolphus, St. John's and St. Mary's all scored two power-play goals each, and St. Olaf tallied one. Against foes this season not from the MIAC, St. Norbert's penalty kill is 71-for-75 (94.7 percent).

UW-Stout scored twice on the power play on Feb. 9, the first NCHA team to score twice with the man advantage against the Green Knights this season.

Belanger Bits:

Senior forward Marc Belanger had his consecutive games scoring streak snapped at 16 when he went scoreless in a 1-1 tie with UW-Superior on Feb. 1. Belanger had scored 13 goals and 13 assists for 26 points during his streak.

Belanger was one game shy of tying Maris Ziedins' team record of 17 for consecutive games scored in, set from Jan. 5-Oct. 30, 2001.

Belanger has scored in 22 of 24 games this season, also not getting on the scoresheet in a 3-1 win at Concordia-Moorhead on Nov. 10.

Belanger carried a nine-game scoring streak into this season, giving him a point in 31 of his last 33 games. In his last 31 games, Belanger has scored 24 goals with 19 assists for 43 points.

With 123 career points, Belanger is tied for seventh at 123 points with Shane Dickson. He trails Connor Hughes by 14 points for sixth at 137 points.

Belanger's 57 career goals leaves him seventh all-time at St. Norbert. He needs three goals to match Hughes in sixth with 60 career markers.

Boyd Banter:

Sophomore forward Matt Boyd has scored 19 points in his last 12 games.

Boyd has scored in 20 of 23 games this season, and has had multiple-point games in seven of his last 12 contests. Boyd has scored nine goals with 10 assists for 19 points in his last 12 games.

Boyd scored overtime game-winners on back-to-back nights, getting the decisive markers against St. Mary's and St. Thomas on Jan. 11-12. He has three career overtime goals.

In 54 career games, Boyd has 26 goals and 39 assists for 65 points.

Milestone Matter:

St. Norbert head coach Tim Coghlin became just the second coach in Northern Collegiate Hockey Association history to record 300 career wins while coaching in the league with the Green Knights' 4-3 overtime win over St. Thomas on Jan. 12. Coghlin's record while St. Norbert has been a member of the NCHA is 304-83-34 in 14 seasons.

Coghlin joined Bemidji State's Bob Peters as the only two coaches to hit that milestone. Peters went 370-134-36 in 17 years (1982, 1984-99).

According to the 2008 NCAA Ice Hockey Records Book, Coghlin entered the 2007-08 season third in
