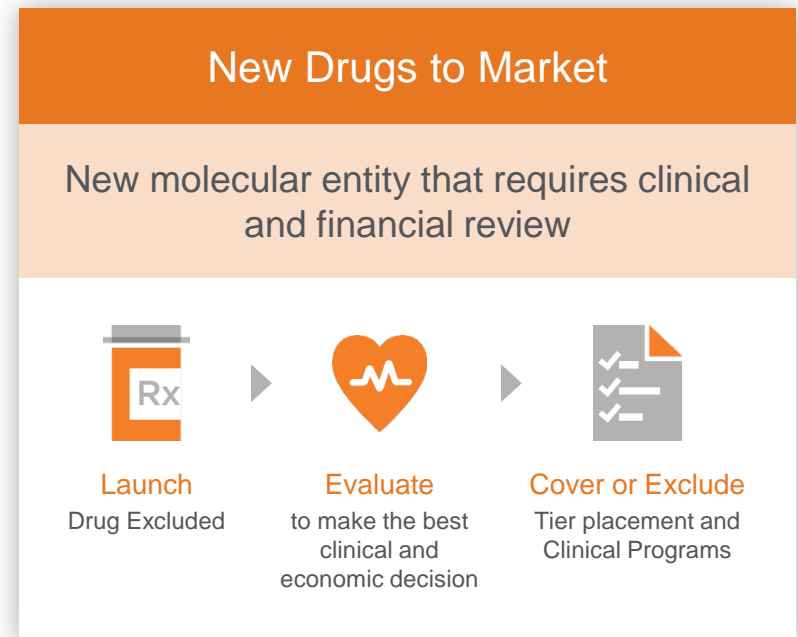
BriovaRx Smart Fill Program Overview

New Drugs to Market Program

Targets new unique chemical entities and new drug products that fall within the scope of the pharmacy benefit that have yet to undergo review by the OptumRx Pharmacy & Therapeutics Committee.

- Temporary exclusion list for new drugs not immediately meeting criteria for placement on one of the other exclusion lists, or for drugs that are pending a decision for placement.
- After six months (or sooner), the drug will either be added to the formulary with any planned UM or added to one of the other exclusion lists



Me Too Drug Program

Ongoing Exclusion List for Drugs therapeutically similar to covered drugs but cost much more.

Combination Medications

Combining **two or more** available medications to make a new one

“Unique” Strengths or Flavors

23mg “unique” strength when **5mg and 10mg** generics are available

Different Delivery Device

Different delivery device, **worth 5x more** than Tier 1 generic?

“Unique” Dosage Forms

Special cherry flavor = **21x more** than Tier 1 generic

Multiple Package Packages

Two or more available medications (packaged together), often an OTC or generic

Non-Essential Drug Program

What is it?

Ongoing Exclusion List that targets new drugs that are deemed non-essential treatments and are deemed out of scope for P&T review, including but not limited to:

Pain Patches and creams

Outrageously expensive topical pain preparations and “kits” made up of ingredients that are inexpensive when sold individually.

Drugs with no legitimate FDA indication and P&T out-of-scope products

High-dollar, non-FDA approved products as well as things like surgical supplies where they likely won't be covered via prescription benefit.
