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What are the possible UnitedHealth Premium designations?

There are several possible Premium designations for a doctor. Doctors who have met the criteria for quality and/or cost efficiency could have one of these four UnitedHealth Premium designations.

It can include the appropriate use of diagnostic testing, prescribed medications, any related procedures and follow-up care and associated costs.

The evaluation also factors in surgical redo rates and any complication-related costs.
