Season of change

is vice president and chief information officer at St. Norbert, with overall responsibility for the implementation of mission-critical enhancements and initiatives in the information technology area.

This year she heads the Big Ideas Group, a task force that was formed last year to identify the next “big idea” for St. Norbert College. The group’s current focus is the creation and promotion of a sustained culture of innovation on campus.

When I arrived at St. Norbert College a little over two years ago, one of the first things I had to get used to was the rhythm of the seasons. I moved here from a part of the country – California, to be exact – that doesn’t really have seasons, per se. While each time of year reflects a transition from the last, fall in particular seems to be, at least to me, the season of change. The leaves turning colors and falling off the trees, the temperature dramatically dropping ... the changes are more visible and dramatic than in other seasonal shifts. Or maybe they are just harder to bear, as we go from warm to cold.

Right now, higher education feels like it, too, is in a season of change. You only have to glance at a newspaper to see the signs: changing demographics that are resulting in a shrinking pool of “traditional” college-bound students; rising tuition costs and student debt; fears about unsustainable business models; and questions – from some really successful and well-educated people – about whether college is even worth it. (Which, by the way, we’re tackling head-on in this issue – turn to page 14 to read more). Higher education, most agree, is heading for, or possibly already in the midst of, a season of disruption.

I’ve just come from a national conference for higher-education information technology professionals where disruption was a major theme. In many ways this makes sense, as much of the talk about disrupting forces in higher education thus far has centered on new and emerging technology-enabled models, like MOOCs (massive open online courses). Clayton Christensen, a Harvard business professor and well-known author, was the keynote speaker for the conference, and focused his address on “disruptive innovations” – those innovations that start at the bottom of a market, transform complex and expensive products into ones that are more affordable and easier to use, and end up displacing existing providers in the marketplace.

What disruption in higher education will look like is unclear. Christensen argues that disruptive innovations do not target the core business, and instead compete with “non-consumption.” (In the case of higher education, this means people who aren’t getting a college degree now.) This theory gives some hope that whatever upheavals occur, they won’t affect what colleges like ours do. But, Christensen contends, to survive a disruption in the marketplace an organization must be modular, with the ability to move its component parts around and draw revenue from different sources than before. And that’s enough to give some institutions pause.

St. Norbert College has been engaged in discussions about the changing nature of higher education for some time. Working with a president who hails from the newspaper business has made us all too aware of what disruptive innovations can do to an industry. One of my roles – and an area of my job that I love the most – is to promote innovation and consider what role technology might play in it, as well as the role it plays in a liberal arts education more broadly. We understand the benefits of diversifying, while still staying true to our unique identity, to ensure our long-term sustainability in our rapidly evolving field. Coincidentally, this approach aligns nicely within Christensen’s concept of modularity, with innovations coming from places other than “the core.”

The seasons follow their predictable cycle but it’s harder to forecast what will come after this season of change in higher education. Many have posited that we will see a winter – a time when institutions will retrench, or die altogether.

But for an institution like St. Norbert, that knows its core business but is willing to adapt and endure – ever ancient, ever new – our efforts will surely lead us to a season of renewal, one where we emerge with new blossoms, ready to flourish with the coming of another spring.

TOUGH TALK

Amanda Kim knows gender discrimination and sexual violence are difficult subjects to discuss, but they are important ones. “For the people who have gone through these situations, we need to have these conversations,” she says. “We need to create an infrastructure where people can discuss their concerns and how any investigations may occur.” The college is working with student groups to raise awareness and to let everyone know “it’s not just about being a victim, but we all have a responsibility whether we’re a roommate, a peer or student to provide help if someone needs it. This is about all of us working together to make our campus a safer, more welcoming place.”



Title IX meets radical hospitality

Say “Title IX” and for many people, it’s the increase in the number of women’s collegiate sports teams that jumps to mind. But the federal civil rights law means much more than that. It’s about gender equality across the entire college campus – both on the field and in the classroom.

In 2011, the government expanded the scope and intensity of Title IX, making colleges more accountable when it comes to addressing and reporting student-on-student sexual harassment and sexual violence. In addition, college employees are required to go through mandated education courses. It’s a challenge St. Norbert College is ready to meet.

“Title IX covers a wide swath from sexual harassment and disparaging treatment to assault,” says **Amanda Kim** (President’s Office). “For St. Norbert College, however, we view this greater awareness of gender inequity as an extension of our radical hospitality initiative and our campus being a welcoming – and safe – place for all students and employees.”

Gabby Zewdu-Habte ’15 says the awareness is much appreciated. “Gender

discrimination is still an issue that needs to be dealt with, but it’s difficult for people to talk about it, so anything we do to get the conversation going is good,” she says.

To comply with the new guidelines, every St. Norbert staff member and student took an online course this semester to raise awareness about harassment and assault, and about what to do if they experience it themselves or witness it. Incoming first-years and all new students also attended an in-person class as part of their orientation process. “It’s really about making sure every single employee and student knows that help is available and where to get it,” Kim says. “This is also about respecting those who have been traumatized or hurt and holding each other accountable to always treat others fairly. That also gets back to our key Norbertine values of human dignity and respect.”

Alex Clemetson ’15, the president of the Student Government Association, says the training is an effective way to make sure everyone has the same information. “There’s a base there for discussion and the training is a great way for everyone to take part,” he says. “I definitely came away with more understanding.”

Time to act

■ Title IX, enacted in 1972, prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender in any federally funded education program or activity. In April of 2011 the Department of Education’s Office of Civil Rights published a letter that defined much higher expectations. It made clear that the requirements of Title IX cover sexual violence, defined as physical sexual acts perpetrated against a person’s will or where a person is incapable of giving consent.

■ As part of St. Norbert’s efforts to raise awareness and connect staff and students with the resources they need, the college has launched a webpage – www.snc.edu/titleix – that serves as a one-stop guide. The page not only contains information about Title IX and links on filing a complaint, it also provides multiple resources to the people reporting a possible complaint.

Song cycle



Soprano **Yi-Lan Niu** (Music) undertook a concert tour in Asia this summer in company with guitarist Christopher Cramer from the faculty of Beloit College. Evidence of a major shift

With the new Gehl-Mulva Science Center nearing completion and the Medical College of Wisconsin's launch in October of its Green Bay campus at St. Norbert, the college is also experiencing a significant increase in potential science and pre-health majors this year. The number of first-year students declaring an interest in biology, chemistry or one of the pre-professional programs rose from 114 in the fall of 2013 to 185 in this year's class – a 60 percent increase. The division of natural sciences is preparing to meet the needs of this cohort as the prospective majors move on through their St. Norbert careers.

On a roll

Katie Ries (Art) was thinking big as she and her team carved a wood block 60 inches long in which they imagined new saints of the Fox River. Along with art major **Dayna Seymour '16**, the printmakers traveled down to the University of Wisconsin-Manitowoc to spend a day inking the block and printing it with a steamroller on loan from the city. Their work was included in the ReallyBIGPRINTS!! exhibit at the Rahr-West Museum and the Hamilton Wood Type & Printing Museum.



Co-authored

Two new books by **Blake Henson** (Music) with Michigan composer/conductor Gerald Custer have been published by GIA Music: "The Composer's Craft: A Practical Guide for Students and Teachers" (2013) and "From Words to Music: a User's Guide to Text for Choral Musicians" (2014). GIA has accepted a proposal for a third book by the two writers, on the subject of arranging music.

GIA has also published Henson's choral compositions "New Waters" and "Hodie Christus Natus Est," and accepted "And Hit a World at Every Plunge," "Modest Needs" and "Eclipse."

Three song cycles by Henson will be heard on campus this year: **Madelaine Baretta '15** (soprano) and **Tanner Lundquist '15** (piano) will perform "Dirge for Two Veterans" this semester, and **Genevieve Gannon '15** (soprano) will

perform "Of Earth and Air" in the spring. Henson says a third, and perhaps the most significant of the cycles, "Magnificat," will receive its premiere this winter. It was composed for **Yi-Lan Niu** (Music, soprano), University of Wisconsin-Green Bay's Courtney Sherman (soprano) and **Elaine Moss** (Music, piano).

The latest book off the St. Norbert College Press is a collection of poems by **Ken Zahorski** (English, Emeritus). Zahorski's poems have appeared in numerous literary magazines and journals as well as in four chapbooks of verse. "The Kindness of Flowers and Other Poems," the first collected edition of his poetry, is edited by his wife, **Marijean Allen Zahorski '70**.

Kelsey Burke (Sociology) has signed a contract with University of California Press for

Coach class works for high fliers

Assistant coaching positions at the NCAA Division III level are, almost by definition, stepping-stones to other positions up the coaching ladder. The St. Norbert women's hockey program is not immune to that dynamic.

Quality assistants have helped the St. Norbert program rise from humble beginnings to its place as one of the top programs in the nation heading into its fifth season. Head coach **Rob Morgan** has watched a steady stream of assistants cut their coaching teeth with the Green Knights. "The neat thing about Division III is they do everything as an assistant coach," Morgan said. "They have a role in equipment management, laundry, planning practices, recruiting, budget, learning to cut video and how to teach on the ice. They're involved in everything. They're not here just pushing pucks."

Jamie Kivi was Morgan's assistant during the program's first two years. Morgan had recruited the Green Bay native as a high school player when he coached at Dartmouth College. Morgan heard through the grapevine that Kivi was looking to get into coaching after graduating from Elmira College, and planted the seeds of joining his staff while attending the Frozen Four. Kivi parlayed her experience at St. Norbert into the head-coaching job at Marian University in Fond du Lac, Wis. After

just her second season with Marian's new program, Kivi earned 2013-14 NCHA Co-Coach of the Year honors along with her mentor, Morgan.

Jillian Kirchner, who joined the Green Knights as an assistant following Kivi's departure, also had her first meeting with Morgan during her recruiting journey. While Morgan wanted Kirchner for Dartmouth, Kirchner accepted a full scholarship to Boston University. She is now a top assistant at Brown University, the Ivy League Division I program. "She moved up quickly, and we're proud to have been a part of her coaching roots," Morgan said. "She was part of the founding program at BU, and now they're a national contender."

Amanda Trunzo filled the assistant position after Kirchner moved on. A finalist for national player of the year honors during her career at Dartmouth under Morgan, Trunzo coached high-school hockey for a year before making the move to St. Norbert. She is now the lead assistant at Gustavus Adolphus College.

"All three had outstanding collegiate careers as players and bring a great amount of knowledge from a student-athlete's perspective," Morgan said. "The common characteristic between all three is that they are super-passionate about wanting to be career coaches."

Tennis triumphs

St. Norbert College wrapped up its fourth Midwest Conference women's tennis championship with a pair of dominating dual-meet wins on the final day of the fall regular season. The Green Knights defeated Knox College 9-0 at home at Western Racquet & Fitness, and then traveled to Ripon College and beat the Red Hawks 9-0 to clinch the crown at Larson Courts.

St. Norbert yielded just six points in the win over Knox and nine points against Ripon.

This is the Green Knights' (13-1, 10-0 MWC) fourth conference title in

women's tennis.

(The team claimed the championship in 1996, 1997 and 2009).

St. Norbert's championship win snapped a streak of four straight titles for Grinnell College, which had won nine of the last 10 crowns. The automatic qualifier to the NCAA Division III Tournament will be determined at the MWC Tournament next April.

Pre-season strong

After a strong junior season, forward **Andrew Schwoerer '15** was one of the 24 Pre-Season All-American basketball selections named by DIII News. Schwoerer averaged 15.6 points per game last season, good for third on the team, and was second on the team at 6.2 rebounds per game on his way to second-team All-MWC honors. He entered his senior season with 1,005 career points.

The Green Knights finished 2013-14 with a 25-2 overall record and a perfect 18-0 mark in MWC play, including a 23-game winning streak that spanned from Nov. 26 to March 8, when their season ended in the second round of the NCAA Division III Tournament against Illinois Wesleyan University.

Jim Neilson was looking at some collages that I was creating. He really liked them, and he knew that they were looking to decorate the interior windows in Dale's, and so he recommended me. One of the greatest things about the project was going through the college

Knowing that these were old black-and-white photos that I was going to colorize, I had vintage on the brain, therefore I tried to pick a palette that gave a certain sense of the antiquated. A lot of times people look at the final product. But the process



can be just as intriguing and exciting as what it is that you create.

Into the wild

Mid-September. Amidst the bustle that is an early fall afternoon at a small liberal arts college, we sought a quiet yet energetic space to begin the work of our course, "American Myths, Community and the Individual." These were not just any eight students. These were the newly minted Gap students, just returned from 26 days in the Boundary Waters. Twenty-six days without a shower. Twenty-six intense days of wilderness backpacking, kayaking and rock-climbing. As a group now seated in a circle in a Mulva Library classroom, they fairly vibrated with a sense of readiness.

I've never experienced a first day quite like this. Here I sat with eight new students who had already worked hard together, disagreed with one another, laughed with one another, shared meals together, had conflicts. I was the stranger, encouraging them to place that experience and the upcoming ones of my course into a critical framework. They were ready: ready to learn, ready to engage, ready to work.

So began our outside-the-box course together. For the next four weeks, we would study American culture and history from the vantage point of the students' community service across four locations in the United States and through various myths of American identity. By myths, we mean stories that tell us truths about a culture. At the same time, however, myths themselves are falsehoods that prove unreliable in the final analysis. Bearing this paradox in mind, the students would read, view and discuss fiction, poetry, essays and films about American culture, at the same time that they were using academic and experiential learning to tease out various myths of American experience.

In the Boundary Waters before my course even began, they read Jon Krakauer's "Into the Wild," which we used to examine the idea of the "rugged individual." While river-rafting, maintaining trails and reclaiming campsites on the Upper San Juan River, the students discussed Barbara Ehrenreich's "Nickel and Dimed," evaluating the concept of "meritocracy" and consumerism in American culture. In Chicago, they tutored immigrants, visited prison inmates, and heard stories from former gang members. And they read Chicago writer Sandra Cisneros' collection "House on Mango Street" to examine the idea of "separate but equal." In

Tennessee, the students began to uncover the varied meanings of community while helping the elderly in their seasonal farm cleanup. They read Ernest Gaines' novel "A Lesson Before Dying" and studied Martin Luther King's "I Have a Dream" speech to consider how community-building takes work and patience, and has not always come easily.

For me, this has all been new territory. The students were traveling without me for much of the course. I was able to meet with them in person for the first week, and for the next three weeks they used iPads to communicate with me. They discussed their experience and ideas together, with the assistance of their two staff leaders. Even when they were off the grid – on the river, for example – they kept track of their responses to the assigned texts and experiences through journals and essays. I had to trust in the work I had put in while designing the course, in the material I had chosen for the students to read and in the assignments I had crafted.

The students' comments were revealing. One quoted the young protagonist in Sandra Cisneros' work: "Those who don't know any better come into our neighborhood scared. They think we're dangerous. They think we will attack them with shiny knives. They are stupid people who are lost and got here by mistake ... our knees go shakity-shake and our car windows get rolled up tight and our eyes look straight." This quote from "The House on Mango Street" shows how most white people think and feel when driving into a bad neighborhood. I actually felt the same way until this week.

We worked on reading closely, thinking deeply, crafting smart questions perhaps even more than answers, making connections across difficult concepts and linking the theoretical with the practical. The students reflected this in their self-evaluations: "One of the first things I took from this course was to wonder why things are the way they are. ... I now find myself asking questions and chasing after answers to the questions I don't know. ... This course has taught me to read between the lines, and try to find a deeper and less literal meaning from the text" Here we see a gift that a college education can encourage in a student: deeper complexity, rather than simple answers.

PAUL KEGEL 1935-2014



The college and community lost a big-hearted and generous friend with the death of **Paul Kegel** (English), July 4.

Kegel was first employed as St. Norbert's director of development, 1991-98, and then as an adjunct professor 1998-2013. During much of this time he also served as a council member in De Pere, as well as on a regional library board. He was an active advocate for adoption. An energetic teacher, he scheduled personal time with students both international and domestic to improve their learning and writing skills. He also taped audio books for students with disabilities.

Kegel was a passionate advocate for college theatrical and music events and regularly attended art gallery shows. He volunteered repeatedly for "Faculty, Flapjacks & Finals" as expert flipper, promoted ESL activities, and even helped financially with exchange students' needs.

It was Kegel's idea to create the Employee Endowed Scholarship, and he served as one of the application adjudicators. Paul was a generous financial contributor to the college as well as to his undergraduate alma mater, Ripon College. His wry sense of humor lives on in the memories of many of his acquaintances. No amount of ribbing was spared him because of his "Ripon" license plates, his abhorrence of email messages, his love of snickerdoodle cookies, and his copious usage of salt at lunch. Paul was a charter member of the Curmudgeons' Table, a notorious cafeteria luncheon gathering of friends currently working or retired from the college. As a very social, helpful and gracious person, he was a man one would like to know and might try to become.

They made a difference



When students, faculty and staff took part in Make a Difference Day this fall, they marked 20 years of the tradition.

Jason Schreiber '97 and **John Dols '96** remember serving as student organizers for the inaugural volunteer effort, Oct. 28, 1995, to assist De Pere residents with yard work and winterizing their homes. The organizational challenges were many. Social media was not available. Email was in its infancy. Finding residents who needed assistance was no easy task. Dols recalls posting flyers in local banks, grocery stores and other businesses. "It was a grassroots effort," he says. "Faculty and staff members found people in their neighborhoods who we could help. I remember a few skeptical faculty members. 'Why would they invite students to their home?' 'Why would students get up on a Saturday morning?' One person even asked, 'What if we get too many people?' I assured everyone that we were not going to get too many people that first year."

The goal was to serve at 100 area sites. In some cases, locating the site was an adventure. "Some of my fond memories are, being chronically lost," says **Carol Cortez** (Communication, Emeritus), who assisted with the service day. "We didn't have GPS. We were navigating to homes. I remember sitting at home the night before with my map out."

Not only did the college connect with residents, but also with De Pere Fire & Rescue. Firefighters and students

distributed more than 600 batteries for smoke detectors. Some 220 students volunteered that first year. "It was definitely a matching game, matching people with projects," says Schreiber. "We had volunteers raking leaves, moving furniture, washing windows, painting different things. Student government, social groups and student organizations got involved."

Cortez says the recipients were more than gracious. "They would invite us in for cookies, lunch or snacks. For some of these people that was much more delightful than having their windows cleaned. It was the conversation. That was such an eye opener for the students. They would get in the van and say, 'She is like my grandmother,' or 'She made us cookies and talked about her life.' Making a difference took all sorts of form that day."

Both of the original Make a Difference Day student organizers serve in leadership positions today. Dols is assistant principal and campus minister at Holy Family Catholic High School in Victoria, Minn. Schreiber recently became director of student life and leadership at California State University San Marcos.

"It's unbelievable to think that (MADD) is still going at St. Norbert," says Schreiber. "I was nervous that we couldn't do it. John and I balanced each other. He always believed it would work out."

"What made it easy is it was the right thing to do," says Dols. "It's what the school is about and should be about."

Team Work

Co-authors turn a scholarly lens onto the vocation of marriage

Astonished.

That's how **Julie Massey '87** (Mission & Ministry) and **Bridget Burke Ravizza** (Religious Studies) describe feeling after talking with 50 married couples about their everyday holiness. They will share what they learned in their book "Project Holiness: Marriage as a Workshop for Everyday Saints."

"We felt astonished a lot of times by the goodness of these people and the depth of their love for one another, and fidelity," says Ravizza, who teaches a course on marriage and family as vocation. Massey says she "came away feeling really humbled by what other people are doing either in living out their faith, either in particular devotion practices or in the way they're attentive to their spouse. There were some examples we encountered that were downright humbling."

"They would talk about how good they are to each other," Ravizza says, "the depth of their prayer life and what they do in the wider community. The kinds of service and hospitality that we heard about were really humbling but also inspirational."

One thing they learned is that there's no one-size-fits-all formula for a successful marriage, whether it's prayer styles or going to bed angry. Some said never go to bed angry. Others said sometimes it takes more time, while trusting that they will deal with the problem later and are not just running from it.

Ravizza and Massey also speak of surprising insights couples have. For example, one woman, in discussing fidelity, said: "I could be better at being appreciative because I could take for granted what a good person my husband is and what he does for me," Ravizza says. "That's one thing I've thought about in my own marriage since we did that project."

Both Ravizza and Massey are married with children and serve with their husbands in the FOCCUS pre-marriage education program in their parishes, working with engaged couples who have completed a 156-item inventory that assesses how each person looks at numerous issues.

The idea for the book sprang from a session on everyday holiness Ravizza attended in 2011 at the Catholic Theological Society of America conference. She asked Massey about co-writing a book "steeped in the experiences of couples and hearing how they talk about the holiness of their own relationships" and "how faith impacts their married and family life."

Massey, who had written two articles on everyday holiness, says she believes "we need to be looking for opportunities to be living out holiness and to think about what we believe" in "the joy and the muck" of daily life.

"We had written a pair of articles for Liguorian magazine and so felt like we had an ability, that our writing styles were similar enough that we felt comfortable drafting and then critiquing each other and reworking drafts," Massey says. "We felt like we were able to do that professionally and that our friendship was able to sustain that."

"And then," she adds with a hearty laugh, "we were blessed with

a lot of ignorance about how much work it is."

Liturgical Press plans to publish the work in time for the World Meeting of Families, scheduled for Sept. 22-27, 2015, in Philadelphia. (At time of press, Pope Francis was expected to attend this event.)

The project began to take shape as they did background reading and determined how to gather information. They formed partnerships with 20 parishes in two Midwest dioceses. These parishes shared names of 105 couples, to whom they sent surveys in summer 2013; 150 of the 210 surveys were returned.

The parishes also introduced them to 50 couples, with some of whom they met from October 2013 to May 2014. In recorded two-hour focus groups, they spoke with 38 of the couples, two to four at a time, and with 12 more in 90-minute single-couple sessions. They asked questions and listened to the couples' stories. The writing began in May.

Throughout the process, the co-authors continued their regular duties and continually assured each other that they were doing what they could, a day at a time.

Then their deadline was moved up a year to coincide with the family conference.

Fortunately, Ravizza was not scheduled to teach this past summer. And the college had recently instituted a staff sabbatical policy that allowed Massey to work half-days for eight weeks over the summer so that she could write during the rest of the day.

Massey says she's grateful for that opportunity and for the support of her staff.

The project also matches Massey's belief "that professional staff in colleges and universities should be involved actively in the life of the mind, that they should be reading, they should be writing, they should be presenting. We work in higher education, we should be scholars of our own sort."

Ravizza, as a member of the teaching faculty, has a belief that complements her co-author's. "I understand my job as a theologian is not to just serve the students – although obviously that's a huge part of what it means to be a professor – but the wider church."

"Project Holiness" will relate the stories and findings from the surveys and interviews in six chapters – friendship, sexuality, sacrament and ritual, service, suffering and fidelity – plus an introduction, appendix and conclusion. The authors see their audience as engaged couples, married people and church professionals, as well as college students studying marriage. They acknowledge that the work has a specifically Catholic focus and frame of reference.

As the writing phase ends, Massey and Ravizza talk about their gratitude to the couples, who, in offering their stories, not only spoke frankly and candidly about their marriages and children but also about their sense of responsibility for this gift. "They were willing to come and share just out of the goodness of their hearts. They were getting nothing out of it," Ravizza says. ♣

College: Is It Worth It?

We're not in Kansas anymore.

A model that has remained largely unchanged for decades and even centuries has undergone radical transformation in recent years. Higher education has entered a realm where textbooks have gone digital, classroom walls have given way to virtual reality and MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) have welcomed the masses.

Combine these sweeping changes with stories of crippling levels of student debt and an economy still recovering from arguably the worst crisis since the Great Depression and it's no wonder that some have begun to question whether college is actually worth the investment – the time, the energy, and yes, the money.

According to an article published in *The Economist* on April 5, 2014, this depends. A lot rides on the school itself and the type of discipline studied. Some degrees pay for themselves, and others may amount to a waste of resources.

Others argue college couldn't be a safer bet in today's climate. In *The New York Times*, David Leonhardt refers to a new set of data in a May 27, 2014, article revealing that the pay gap between college graduates and all others has hit a record high, leading him to conclude that "the decision not to attend college for fear that it's a bad deal is among the most economically irrational decisions anybody could make in 2014."

As the recession lingers on in the nation's collective consciousness and many look to stretch their dollars with greater diligence, where in the world does a small Catholic liberal arts institution and the lone Norbertine college in existence fit into this larger issue of national debate?

National rankings at least begin to paint a picture of a school that offers exceptional value. In particular,

St. Norbert appears high on recent lists released by publications that rate specifically on education and affordability. Dig a little deeper, though, and it's the personal accounts that add substance to the numbers, liven up the canvas and illustrate return on investment.

Opportunities explored

For **Cabrini Jablon '97** (Admissions), affordability was an issue at the heart of her own search for the place to call home during her formative years. Initially, she didn't anticipate that she would be able to afford the school of her choice, but after completing the financial aid process, Jablon came to realize that St. Norbert was a viable option after all.

During her undergraduate years, she worked in the college's office of admission as a tour guide, which helped shape the direction of her career path. "That's how I began to think about the profession of admission counseling," Jablon notes. "Being exposed to working in the admissions office and higher ed in general helped me solidify my career goals."

Now as she underscores the value of a St. Norbert education to prospective students, Jablon is able to share not only the obvious highlights like the four-year graduation guarantee or the individualized attention from faculty but also her own experiences as both student and staff member at a school that has never lost its luster.

"There's just that warm feeling as if I was a first-year student that I still get every day when I come to campus," she says.

Like Jablon, **Steven Garza '13** says his college experience left a lasting impression, and it didn't waste any time in doing so. "Into the Streets" brought him and other first-year students into the Green Bay area community to engage in a day of volunteer service

work before classes even got underway. It was an experience that he says set the tone for an education that instilled the value of serving others.

"The greatest fulfilment we can have in life is to serve another person, serve a greater cause, serve a greater need," he says. "I personally believe that it's very important to want to serve bigger causes, and one way I am doing that right now is working in the federal government as a political appointee," he says.

His current role as special assistant to the White House liaison with the Department of Commerce came about, at least in part, because of the support he received as he took advantage of learning that existed beyond college grounds. "St. Norbert helped find me opportunity and fostered my drive to find opportunity," he says, pointing to an internship with the office of the chief of staff in the White House as an example.

Everyone was willing to find a way to make it work, Garza recalls. "St. Norbert was allowing me the opportunity to go off campus, expand my educational experiences, and get a foot in the door," he says. "It was one of the greatest honors of my life, and St. Norbert played a role in helping make that opportunity happen."

Bolstering belief

According to Garza, one of the elements that sets St. Norbert College apart is the genuine passion displayed by faculty along with a willingness to share that with students so they, too, can pursue their own unique interests with a similar sense of enthusiasm.

The chance to foster meaningful relationships with faculty members can pay big dividends in other ways as well. "There is no way that I would be where I am today without St. Norbert," says **Marybeth Gasman '90**, professor of higher education at the University of Pennsylvania.

By her own account, Gasman grew up in a poor family in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. "Not a lot of people believe in you when you grow up that way," she says. "My whole life I've had people say things to me like, 'You're not that smart, but at least you work hard.'"

Mentoring and encouragement from faculty members **Kevin Hutchinson** (Communication and Media Studies) and **Eliot Elfner** (Business Administration) had a profound effect on her future. "Even when other people didn't think I was that smart, they always believed in me," she says. "And that makes a big difference."

A tenured professor at an Ivy League school by the age of 40, Gasman has more than proven her smarts

through her many successes within academia, but the importance of the type of support she received early on is difficult to measure or quantify.

Mention numbers, though, to **John Koker '84**, dean of the College of Letters & Science at University of Wisconsin Oshkosh, and he'll likely light up. Hang around campus long enough, too, and you might just spot him acting in unexpected ways.

A professor of mathematics with a passion for the stage, Koker sustains his lifelong interest in theatre by taking on roles in student-produced plays and films. In the process, he's become a walking personification of what a liberal education can foster and send out into the world.

"I often say that going to college is the best thing I have done in my life," says Koker, whose academic journey began when he arrived at St. Norbert as a first-generation college student. (*This fall, his alma mater adds to his long list of honors received with its own Alumni Award for Distinguished Achievement in Education. See page 31.*)

During a stretch when it's become popular to criticize the payoff of a college degree based on initial job placement and earnings, Koker reminds that a shortsighted view misses out on plenty. "It is well-documented that even though the cost of college is quite expensive, it pays for itself in the long run," he says, referring to a January 22, 2014, report entitled "How Liberal Arts and Sciences Majors Fare in Employment" that was released by the Association of American Colleges & Universities and the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems.

The report examines earnings and long-term career paths for college graduates with various undergraduate majors, and answers questions commonly posed by students, parents and policymakers about the value of college degrees. According to Koker, it argues that "whatever undergraduate major they may choose, students who pursue their major within the context of a broad liberal education substantially increase their likelihood of achieving long-term professional success."

Another key finding from the report, adds Koker, is that in addition to higher salaries, college graduates generally have higher job satisfaction and a higher quality of life. They are also more likely to become involved in their communities and follow their passions.

Sought-after skills

According to **President Tom Kunkel**, when employers are asked what it is they're looking for in college graduates, time and again they answer with

Straight to the source

In order to better understand the value a St. Norbert College education brings to the table, the office of institutional effectiveness developed a survey to pick the brains of those who seem best equipped to offer their thoughts on the matter: the individuals who have experienced and paid for an education at St. Norbert.

The survey reached out to alumni who have been out of school long enough to become well-established in their careers while simultaneously targeting those who are likely still pursuing them. Of those who graduated between 1983 and 1998, more than 400 responded.

"I do think the findings are gratifying," says **President Tom Kunkel**. "The satisfaction with St. Norbert was generally very high. There's no question that the great majority of them felt like this college was

definitely worth the expense to them."

This is evidenced, in part, by the view that their alma mater does a better job of providing value for money spent when compared with the higher education system as a whole. In this regard, 22 percent of respondents rated St. Norbert as "excellent" and 31 percent as "very good" versus 7 and 25 percent, respectively.

But respondents were honest about the financial impact of their education on their later life. For some, college had not necessarily translated into higher-paying jobs or entry into a career that directly connected to their area of study. Others questioned the viability of financing an education at St. Norbert today knowing the price tag has continued to rise over the years.

Like so many others across the nation,

a large proportion had been significantly impacted by the expense of their education. The highest proportion of respondents – at 44 percent – had taken between six and 10 years to repay student loans (their own and their partner/spouse's), which affected other important life decisions to a "great extent": 74 percent had delayed marriage, 70 percent had postponed the process of starting a family, and 65 percent had altered their choice of career.

Beyond this type of hard data, Kunkel expresses his appreciation that so many alumni – roughly two-thirds of respondents – took the time to answer the open-ended questions presented within the survey. This, he says, is where the nuances are revealed that help the college determine what it's doing particularly well and how it can work to better serve students moving forward.

Higher education, particularly private Catholic higher education, needs to steadily make the case for the intrinsic value of a liberal arts education AND its impact on workforce development and lifetime earning power for those with higher education degrees.

Going to college teaches you how to think more than it defines your career path. The more nimble your thinking, the more horizons will open up for you.

I learned so much about thinking critically. I was challenged daily. I experienced so many great opportunities ... I had amazing instructors who opened whole new worlds to me. I wasn't just another student, I was made to feel valued. ... I feel very blessed to have had an SNC education.

I think it is worth the time but I do agree the cost is astronomical and hard to finance for many. I wish it was more affordable for all.

the same attributes: the ability to think critically, work in teams, communicate effectively and adapt to change. “All of these things are hallmarks of a liberal arts education, so we are providing the things that employers say they want,” he notes.

Case in point? Meet Craig Dickman, founder, CEO and chief innovation officer of Breakthrough Fuel. His company manages the energy that companies like Procter & Gamble, Georgia-Pacific and John Deere use to move products to market.

It is a company built upon innovation and creativity, explains Dickman. It all started with a couple of patents and now, 10 years in, there are tangible efforts made to develop at least one new patentable product each year.

“Organizations like ours that are kind of fast-moving and changing within the marketplace really do need people who can look at problems and figure it out, bring a fresh pair of eyes, and bring a creative skill,” he says. Beyond that creativity, he highlights the ability to communicate and collaborate effectively as skills fostered particularly well at St. Norbert.

The last piece of the puzzle, Dickman says, is confidence, because – within six or nine months of joining his team – employees could realistically be interacting with senior leaders at publicly traded companies with every expectation that they can hold their own.

“Folks won’t give themselves the license to think or attack problems and certainly won’t communicate them if they don’t have confidence,” he says, adding that a liberal arts education puts students in a situation where they have the ability to build self-assurance and practice the skills that allow them to be effective members of the workforce.

As his company has grown, Dickman has found what he is looking for in St. Norbert graduates time and again. Since inception, he has hired nine alumni of the school, a figure amounting to 20 percent of his total staff.

“If we’ve got a student coming out with an undergraduate liberal arts degree who is a creative thinker, who can communicate, who can work with others and collaborate, and is confident enough to articulate who they are, what they are doing, and what they hope to accomplish,” he says, “then we have, I think, a really exceptional person stepping into our organization.”

Transformative experience

While a high-quality education ought to prepare its students for jobs, careers and financial stability, there are plenty of other elements that, when fostered, can

create an experience that just might transcend dollars and cents.

“My SNC education was worth the time, money and effort, not because it instantly translated into a high-paying job, but because it helped me transform myself as a person,” noted one alumni survey respondent. “You cannot put a price on the experiences I had at St. Norbert College,” said another. “It was a safe environment where I could explore who I was and who I wanted to become.”

“It gave me the opportunity to see the world from a different perspective,” Koker says, noting the chance to meet people from other parts of the country and world, the opportunity to study other cultures and religions, and the ability to head off campus during spring breaks and vacations to work in homeless shelters through the campus ministry program. “It was a chance to really grow,” he adds, “and that’s where it all started.”

When relationships are factored into the equation, it’s hard to ignore the enhanced opportunities for building lasting connections within a residential campus setting where face-to-face interaction continues to remain the norm despite emerging trends in higher education.

“The friends I met have become lifelong friends,” wrote one alum. “We turn to one another in every crisis and joy, after 30 or more years.” Others speak of the meaningful relationships developed with faculty and staff. “I loved the small class size,” wrote one. “I enjoyed getting to know my professors. I felt like part of a family.” Still others, including Koker, mention marriages whose beginnings can be traced back to life at St. Norbert.

In the midst of swirling national debate about the worth of a college education, Kunkel says this apparent crossroads faced by the higher-education system as a whole isn’t such a bad thing. It’s leading to a shake-up of the status quo, providing more opportunities for people to pursue an education, and forcing traditional institutions to do what they do best while finding ways to differentiate themselves.

In St. Norbert’s case, it means taking the positive attributes at the core of the school and mixing in today’s modern tools and capabilities in order to fuse it into “a really unique, high-quality 21st-century educational experience,” Kunkel says, all while keeping affordability as the main priority moving forward.



By drawing on an ancient scripture for the series of triptychs that now grace the atrium of the Gehl-Mulva Science Center, the design team was able to meet its charge: to awaken a sense of creative inquiry in all those who would ultimately use the building.



TRIPTYCH 1: The Universe, The Heavens

“He who sings, prays twice,” said St. Augustine, which must be one reason why canticles and psalms are at the heart of the liturgy. Among these songs of praise is the Canticum of Daniel, sung faithfully as part of the daily office every Sunday and on every major feast of the church. So when the **Rev. Andrew Ciferni, O.Praem., '64** was pondering a problem both philosophical and aesthetic, it was no surprise that it was the

text of the Canticum that would inspire him.

The dialogue between faith and reason: It’s an argument – or, perhaps, no argument at all – that is one of the major components of the Catholic intellectual tradition. And it was on Ciferni’s mind in particular, in his role as one member of the team charged with ensuring that the environmental design of the new science center was sensitive to the very purpose that had brought

the building into being.

Ciferni says: “When I pray the Canticale I try to image those things it mentions – mountains and hills, ice and snow. It’s an expression of Hebrew cosmology, which is incredibly parallel to our understanding of the origins of the universe. You go from fish to birds to mammals ... Then you come to humanity, and humanity, ultimately, is praising God.”

The lofty atrium calls for a piece on a monumental scale that

can be read equally by those on its first and second floors. The installation of an ethereal work of art inspired by the Canticale transforms the space into a place of celebration. “Now you have an illustration that says, look up there,” says **Drew Van Fossen** (Communications). “There you have the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. That’s perfect *communio*. We strive to have that kind of relationship.” The canticale represents *communio* from below, rising to the heavenly ideal.



TRIPTYCH 4: The Human Family as the Voice of Creation Praising God

The steeple of Old St. Joe's, next-door neighbor to the science center, is a visible presence throughout the atrium, adding to the sense that this is sacred space.

"One way to imagine the conversation between faith and reason, science and religion," says the **Rev. Jay Fostner, O.Praem., '84**, "is that we're standing in the church door. And from that spot, we're called to look both in, and out. The conversation continues."

 An inventive and thoughtful approach to signage and decorative elements for the Gehl-Mulva Science Center nods both to the college's rootedness in the Norbertine tradition and its ongoing participation in the Catholic intellectual tradition. snc.edu/magazine

St. Norbert College takes to the road

The alumni office faces a logistical challenge each year as it brainstorms ways to connect with a St. Norbert College alumni base spread across the country. Organizing alumni events in cities with large populations of alumni is a no-brainer but what about places where grads are more scattered – places like Iowa, Nebraska, Colorado and Missouri?

This summer there was one simple answer: Road trip!

John Sabo '07 and **Beth Riebe '04** (Advancement), along with Norby the Knight, set off on a 10-day excellent adventure that covered 3,300 miles during the latter half of July. The trip not only succeeded in creating opportunities for in-person interaction, it also generated a level of social media engagement that exceeded expectations.

"From day one, we knew we wanted to make this trip interactive with our alumni community," Sabo says. "We posted to Facebook, Twitter and the college's blog site during the trip, which created a reason for alums to 'like' our Facebook page and follow us on Twitter."

The impetus for the trip was an alumni golf outing organized by **Mark Condon '79**, general manager at Red Rocks Country Club near Denver. A strong Denver-area alumni group had been conducting events the past few years, and the July 21 outing date worked with the schedule of college president **Tom Kunkel**.

"The golf outing had 22 players, which was more than we expected," Sabo says. "The first group to sign

up was from Baraboo, Wis. It included an alumni member who planned her annual trip to Colorado around the golf outing."

On the way to Colorado, the road trip trio made stops at several places suggested by alumni through social media interaction. The group would post where it was headed and ask for thoughts on potential meet-up locations.

Alumni were more than happy to offer suggestions on Facebook, with one member even driving an hour to meet the travelers in Omaha, Neb. The group also made stops in Janesville, Wis.; Dubuque, Dyersville and Des Moines, Iowa; Kearney, Neb.; Colorado Springs, Denver and Morrison, Colo.; and Kansas City and St. Louis, Mo.

"In the past, our communication on Facebook was one-way," Sabo explains. "We would post something and alums would comment. We wanted to start using Facebook as a two-way communication, and we thought this might be a cool way to start. We had some areas in mind to visit, but we didn't have any specific locations for happy hours and dinners."

Facebook and Twitter engagement made a significant jump during the trip, with a 569 percent increase in Facebook total reach compared to average and a 16.7 percent increase in Twitter followers.

"Our engagement is down since the road trip ended, but it still has increased from where it was before the trip," Sabo says. "This was definitely something we can use as a template to visit other locations in the future."



Going the distance

Runner **Jerry Feldhausen '73**, barely out of school, was enjoying his first job at Nicolet Paper, just across the street from campus, when track coach **Larry Van Alstine '56** invited him to return as founding coach of St. Norbert's new varsity cross-country team.

Also in attendance were annual regulars like Moore, **Mike Lambert '82**, **Bill Stenz '86** and **Amy (Geurts) Stenz '84**, as well as runners traveling from as far afield as California, Texas and Pennsylvania.

Since 1990, the meet has also honored the life of **Tom Barry '77**, himself a founding member of the team. Barry, who followed Feldhausen as coach 1989-90, was to die suddenly at the age of 35.

Current coach **Don Augustine** likes his team to know a little of the history of their storied program and has traditionally invited Feldhausen and Moore or another alum, along with Barry's mother, **Esther**, to meet his runners at the beginning of the season. This year, he delayed this encounter until the eve of the invitational so that other returning runners were able to meet with today's Green Knights.



Zehren's studies at St. Norbert were interrupted by World War II. He served three-plus years in the U.S. Army, including more than 200 days in combat in Europe. His military honors include a Purple Heart.

"We were told that if we enlisted that we would be able to finish our degrees first, but that didn't happen," he says. "I came back to St. Norbert in (fall) 1946."

Zehren served as the editor of the 50th edition of the St. Norbert College yearbook. In his last semester, the Rev. Peter Pritzl, O.Praem., '25, asked him to teach a qualitative analysis class.

In later life, Zehren has received multiple honors, including St. Norbert's Distinguished Achievement Award in Natural Sciences in 1977 and the Alma Mater Award in 2005.



The business of learning

Vince Zehren '48 suggests that his memory is fading, but a guided tour of the upper level of his home proves otherwise. Framed photos, certificates, awards and honors cover a vast amount of wall space. Zehren offers names, places, anecdotes or tidbits for each. A photograph of his late wife, Virginia, causes him to pause. A smile follows. "She was so smart. I can't figure out to this day the connection, what she saw in me," he says with a laugh.

Zehren understates his academic prowess. After majoring in chemistry as an undergraduate, he earned a master's in dairy industry and a Ph.D. in food science and biochemistry from the University of Wisconsin. In 1952, he became one of the school's first Fulbright Scholars. That scholarship supported a year of study in New Zealand. And, in 1997, well into his seventies, Zehren added a master's in business administration from Western Kentucky University. It was an education that supported his vocation: Zehren was born to be a cheesemaker.

"I was born in the living quarters of a Wisconsin cheese factory in Shawano County," he explains. "My dad was a pioneer Wisconsin cheesemaker, my uncles, my grandfathers, cousins, myself and my brother. The cheese industry was our industry."

The oldest of seven children, Zehren began working in his father's cheese factory at age 13 and earned his cheesemaker's license at age 18. The family moved to a number of factories during his youth. His father made his final career stop at a cheese factory located between Bonduel and Cecil, which indirectly led Zehren to St. Norbert.

"Camp Tivoli, which was run by the Norbertines, was nearby on Shawano Lake," he explains. "The Norbertine priests said Mass at St. Martin Church in Cecil. I remember Fr. (Patrick) Butler (O.Praem.)."

While in graduate school, he met Virginia, who was also a student in the food science program. "She had her degree in pharmacy, but when she graduated, she was only 20 years old, so they wouldn't give her a license," explains Zehren. "She got a job with Kraft through the war and then moved on to Madison."

Zehren returned to the cheese industry in 1954 when he began a long career at Schreiber Foods in Green Bay. "My first role was quality control and making new products in the laboratory," he says. "I would make a lot of visits to other cheese factories. I never worked in the sales department, but if there was a complaint, that was my job to take care of it."

In 1962, Zehren became one of a group of employee-owners. He later served as director of manufacturing and, during his last four years, prior to retirement in 1989, he was vice president of industrial affairs. In 1986, Schreiber Foods established the Vincent L. Zehren Award of Excellence in Applied Technology. He was the first recipient.

"When I was born, there were 2,300 cheese factories in Wisconsin. Now there are 130 to 140, so the industry has completely changed. In Shawano County, there were 120 cheese factories. Now I believe there is only one left."

At age 90, Zehren still stays on top of the industry. He receives a daily report from Schreiber and reads "Cheese Report," a weekly publication.

Taking it on the chin



When **Frank Kasell '06** was an undergraduate, he attempted to break the world record for balancing milk crates on his chin – a story we were delighted to bring you in our Winter 2005 issue. 



Innovation Leads the Way

It's rather fashionable lately for opinionistas to deride higher education as the most hidebound enterprise this side of blacksmithing. Both, they imply, have been hammering out their products in pretty much the same way for centuries.

Well, it's indisputable that colleges like change even less than most folks do, but it is certainly not true that "campus innovation" is an oxymoron. In fact, most of the post-secondary institutions I know are altering the way they do business almost by the week. And St. Norbert College is one of them.

True, this adaptation is happening in large part because colleges and universities, like all modern institutions, realize they must adapt or die amid a highly competitive and disruptive environment. But at St. Norbert, we are also changing because it's in the best interests of our students.

Take our institution-wide commitment to the sciences. We knew from the experience of other schools that once we started erecting a new building for the teaching of natural sciences we could expect a spike in the number of first-years pursuing these majors. But then we entered into our bold – and virtually unprecedented for a liberal arts college – partnership with the Medical College of Wisconsin, which has located a regional campus within the new Gehl-Mulva Science Center and will welcome its charter class next July. That's when things really got interesting.

How interesting? Well, six years ago the percentage of SNC first-years majoring in the so-called "hard sciences" – which for these purposes are defined as chemistry, biology, pre-medicine, other pre-health areas (e.g., dentistry, veterinary medicine), and nursing – stood at 14 percent. In the intervening years, as we enhanced our academic profile, that number gradually ticked up, so that it stood at 22 percent of first-year students arriving in 2013.

But for this fall's entering class, that figure is 35 percent – more than one-third of the

entire class. As massive as the new Gehl-Mulva complex is, maybe it's not big enough!

The past year also was notable because our faculty authorized a Master of Business Administration program, which we will kick off in the fall of 2015. The M.B.A. program will be housed in the new Donald J. Schneider School of Business & Economics. Both the program and school have been endowed through the generosity of Patricia Schneider, Don's widow, as a recognition of how much the trucking and logistics entrepreneur, Class of '57, loved his alma mater.

Now, starting an M.B.A. program may not strike you as all that radical. But I can assure you that at a classically undergraduate, liberal arts institution like St. Norbert, it was a leap.

We've been teaching business here from our earliest days (when the subject was called "the commercial arts"), and it has always been one of our most popular majors. So business education is part of our DNA. But the M.B.A. program will take this commitment to an entirely new sphere – to a new audience, to a new level of expertise, and to a new collaboration with the northeast Wisconsin business community. In the process it will also help us diversify our revenue base. And a good bit of that new revenue, incidentally, will go to help make St. Norbert more affordable for our undergraduate students.

Another entrepreneurial project we're proud of is our new "Gap Experience." As I write this, eight eager first-years are piloting what amounts to a more "hands-on" start to their college education than has been the norm. Under the tutelage of Laura Fredrickson, whose background is in education and environmental studies, these intrepid eight are spending their fall semester in outdoor leadership courses, followed by service trips around America and even internationally. But by this January, they will be back on campus and settling into traditional courses, right on schedule to graduate with the rest of the Class of 2018.

The Gap program is an acknowledgement that, today, there can be no "one road" to postsecondary education. It is also a Big Idea for us.

And you may remember that about this time a year ago I was inviting you to send in your own "big ideas" for the future of St. Norbert. We were delighted and gratified that more than 250 of you took us up on the offer. Our Big Ideas task force combined and distilled those to five proposals that we consider most promising – suggestions that ranged from becoming a catalyst for new businesses to developing a residential community at the edge of campus for retirees who want to stay intellectually and emotionally connected to SNC. Now we are undertaking a fuller evaluation of these prospects, and we'll keep you posted on our progress.

All over campus we are innovating to utilize the digital environment and its dazzling new tools to best effect. It was at our behest that six outstanding liberal arts colleges in the upper Midwest came together in a kind of consortium to share best practices in digital pedagogy. And a few months ago a number of those schools, again led by SNC, secured a prestigious Teagle Foundation grant to develop pilot programs teaching core intellectual skills in non-traditional ways. Indeed, in classroom after classroom, SNC faculty members are reimagining how they teach their courses and conveying information in a much more interactive way, promoting 21st-century learning in a manner that is now second nature to this generation of students.

Finally, I would note that one year ago we opened the beautiful Cassandra Voss Center, which is devoted to studying issues of gender and identity in all their complex iterations. We started an incredible run of creative programming with the dynamic founder of GoldieBlox, Debbie Sterling, who came here for the Midwest launch of a toy designed to spur young girls to pursue engineering and the

sciences. We concluded the year with a rare public presentation by the author and social critic bell hooks.

As you know, within this annual report you'll find recognition of you and your financial generosity to the college, and needless to say virtually none of the aforementioned initiatives would be possible without that kind of support.

One measure of your passion is the fact that Full Ahead: Campaign St. Norbert has been a spectacular success. You'll hear more about that later this year.

Meantime, another measure is that the world is paying more attention than ever to what is happening at St. Norbert College, and to how your generosity allows us to innovate in a way that remains consistent with our mission and our values.

Recently U.S. News published its rankings of national liberal arts colleges for 2014-15, and I'm pleased to report St. Norbert jumped up 11 full spots to 123, the highest placement in our history as we continue our campus-wide pursuit of excellence.

But to be honest, I was just as proud when, as it recently did, Money magazine rated us as the 20th among its "Most Affordable Colleges in America," just ahead of such outstanding institutions as Wabash, Augustana, Grinnell and Lake Forest colleges. Or when, at the same time, the highly respected Washington Monthly placed us 32nd among top American liberal arts colleges as "Best Bang for the Buck." These institutions, the magazine said, "do the best job of helping non-wealthy students attain marketable degrees at affordable prices."

You can't accomplish results like this by standing still. And taken together, these rankings suggest that St. Norbert College is a place where a student can get a great education at a fair, affordable cost.

That was the idea when Abbot Pennings – quite the entrepreneur in his own right – got us going 116 years ago. It still is.


Many authors ... one terrific story
