All of us at St. Norbert College would like to extend our thanks to you for your understanding while we navigate these unprecedented times related to the COVID-19 pandemic, and we'd like to share our deep gratitude for the support you gave to your students as they completed their spring semester in such a unique way.

As the college continues to monitor the COVID-19 situation and plan for the future, the health and safety of our students, faculty and staff have remained our top priority. To that end, we have made adjustments to the Fall 2020 academic calendar, which are outlined below in a message recently shared with your student. The changes allow the fall semester to end before Thanksgiving, so that students do not have to return to campus after an extended break and to minimize the transmission of the virus to campus.

Greetings students,

With the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, St. Norbert College must remain flexible in responding to developing circumstances. One way we are demonstrating this flexibility is by adjusting the Fall 2020 academic calendar. Below I've outlined some important changes to the fall academic calendar:

- Fall classes will begin Monday, Aug. 24.
- We will cancel Long Weekend to minimize the spread of the virus after extended travels.
- Advising days will be Oct. 28 and Nov. 3.
- On-campus instruction will end Tuesday, Nov. 24.
- Virtual instruction will occur on Wednesday, Nov. 25, ensuring required weeks of instruction for compliance purposes.

- Remote instruction, typically in the form of a final exam, will occur Nov. 30 through Dec. 4.
