BCA Marburg utilizes 3 different credit value systems - US credits, ECTS credits, and SW weekly hours. It is the student's responsibility to verify with the SNC Registrar's Office that the registered course load is equivalent to a minimum of 12 St. Norbert College semester hours.

## **Program Language**

Courses at BCA Marburg are primarily taught in German. Courses taken in English cannot transfer as German electives.

## **General Transfer Information**

Please note that students must take the equivalent of a full time course load (12 credits minimum) when studying abroad to qualify for financial aid.

30 ECTS at BCA Marburg are equivalent to 15 St. Norbert College semester credits. 16 US or SW credits at BCA Marburg are equivalent to 16 St. Norbert College semester credits.

If a student receives a grade of **D** (4-) or lower, then the student will not earn credit for that course. It will count as credits attempted, not earned, and will be reflected on the student's St. Norbert transcript as **NT** (**Not Transferable**).

All courses passed while abroad transfer with a grade of **T (Transferable)**. Students do not receive the SNC equivalent grade and FIE London grades are not factored into the student's GPA. The SNC grade equivalency is provided as a courtesy for the student to better understand the minimum grade required to earn transfer credit.
