New business (4:05)

New Commuter Lounge (Ms. Riggle)

Riggle: I have been communicating with the group Knights En Route on campus. There is currently a commuter lounge on campus in the art building, but they are losing access to that space at the end of the semester. They have written up a nice proposal and list of things they are looking for in the new lounge on campus.

Freye: I really hope we can see this happen, and I have talked with a lot of commuters lately. At the very least, we should be able to provide this for them. A spot in the library or the campus center would be ideal for them. It is important that we make them feel like they are a part of the campus community.

Dressel: I say that out of the three options they are considering, the campus center is probably the best option. That is where students are supposed to be engaged with other students. The library is not as engaging of a place, since it is meant for studying.

Hess: The library is also the place for a lot of other organizations on campus. The center for Norbertine studies and the honors center.

Fitzwater: If the students wish to talk and be more rowdy, the campus center is probably a better place. Gonnering: Looking at the top three places being considered, what is the faculty or the students ranking? Riggle: It was the commuter's rankings. I believe they have been working with Corday on this. They are looking for our approval and what we think of their proposal.

Dressel: THe college has been working for a long time in making a commuter lounge. The art center place is only temporary, but the administration is very supportive of this initiative.

Hunt: Is it not really our place to say where the lounge is located?

Ulrich: I entertain a motion to informally approve the commuter lounge proposal.

LASS (Mr. Hess)

Hess: The scholarship has been continuing the project to bring the Menominee flag to campus. A ceremony has been planned with administration. Looking to get drummers and a larger sized flag for the flagpole. Hoping to hand off a lot of the work to administration since we have done the most of the legwork. Looking at getting members of the Indigenous People on campus onto the Board of Trustees.

GIF (Mr. Dressel)

Dressel: The Green Initiative Fund (\$7.50/smeester) is being run by ESAC on campus. Looking to get the fund back into student's control. I have a proposal for the constitution to have a total of three students on SAFAC will also sit on the Green Initiative Fund Allocations Committee (GIFAC). One shall be the Finance Coordinator and of the other two, one shall serve as chair of GIFAC.

The second edit was under the position of finance coordinator. The coordinator shall keep a detailed budget through their work on the GIFAC.

Also, campaigning may only occur in the week between the end of nomination acceptance and elections, ending at 9:00pm on the day the elections end.

Student Organization Representation (Ms. Hunt)

Updates from representatives.

Fitzwater: The Zambia Project came up to discuss how organizations cannot use Venmo or other forms of electronic payment. John Seckel does not allow fundraising through Venmo, PayPal, or other electronic payment services. The Zambia Project used those services as the primary way of collecting funds at their fundraising events.

Freye: I did overhear a little bit of conversation... this conversation has been occurring and it has been hoping to get rid of Venmo here at SNC. Some liability issues. We would be better off providing new solutions for these groups. In the foreseeable future Venmo is not going to be an option. Maybe the machine that they use for taking Meal Dollars on campus for those kinds of fundraisers. Also maybe looking into other apps or electronic forms.

Gonnering: It is not always students who are donating but families and off-campus organizations. So how do we accept donations from these groups if they do not allow meal dollars?

Edelbeck: Can the school offer microsites for their student organizations or philanthropies? For our sorority, we need to have direct fundraising websites to go towards the chapter or larger organization. Looking into microsites for student organizations.

Fitzwater: A lot of people do not use their club emails. Using the email as the base for the account which thes school can then come in and audit it.

Dressel: Do we want to draft a letter to send to the LSE office? A quick solution before their fundraiser on May 2nd?

Ulrich: Why can't the Zambia Project just use the same fundraising technique as sororities on campus? Hunt: It should be pretty easy, we can even share the QR code that we are using for our sorority.
